Structure Fire: Firefighters worked through a structure fire at the Pet Supply store on Stockton Street and Kettleman. Units arrived to find an exterior fire that had extended into the walls. Thankfully, no injuries were reported.

Arson Fire: An individual walked up and torched another transients personal items on the abandoned RR crossing over Hwy 99 south of Lodi Avenue (pictured left).

NARCAN Deployment: Officers responded to a Fentanyl overdose of a 23-year old male from Lodi and administered two doses of NARCAN. The male regained consciousness, and was transported to LMH for medical evaluation. Fire crews also responded to two additional overdoses. Fentanyl is on the rise as reported by Police Chief Brucia.

Burglary: Officers responded to a burglary in progress where two subjects fled from a vehicle. One of the two subjects was found hiding behind a vehicle parked in the driveway, and was detained at gunpoint and ultimately identified as a 15-year old male from Lodi. The second individual was not located. Approximately six vehicles were found to be unlocked and ransacked. The juvenile was arrested, cited and released to his parents.
